PARAIN received master in 1763: crowned
hammer / RP / P. (the second P is the initial of
Paris) Control hallmark "à la nave", with the arms
of Paris, used from 1765. Height: 11 cm. PARIS,
Last third of the 18th century In very good
condition The cups used by the street vendors of
aniseed water in Paris were of the same model but
not engraved. This is why they were often called
