Jan Kobell the elder (1756-1833) was a painter and
engraver from a family of Dutch artists from
Rotterdam. He was active in Rotterdam at the end
of the 18th and beginning of the 19th century. Jan
Kobell the elder painted pre-romantic landscapes
with a fine yellow light under the influence of the
painter Claude Gellée known as Le Lorrain. He
signed with a monogram "JK" in a beautiful,
recognizable handwriting. He had a brother
Hendrick Kobell (1751-1779) who was a marine
painter who settled in Germany. Jan Kobell the
Elder is sometimes confused with his nephew Jan
