A student of the Amsterdam Academy, he also benefited from the direct influence of his uncle, the famous painter Cornelis Springer, a renowned portrait and landscape painter. Rust follows the realist tradition of the 19th century, combining precision of drawing with a sense of atmosphere. He subtly captured the moods of the sea and harbor

atmospheres, particularly during the technological transition from traditional sailing ships to the first steamships. About the painting This painting perfectly embodies the tension of this pivotal era, where sail coexisted with steam propulsion. The opposition between the small human boat and the large mechanical ship suggests a contrast between tradition and modernity. The dramatic effect of the sky and the waves amplifies this impression of struggle against the elements.
