Oriented towards the implementation of presentation pieces such as asparagus services and other table-pictures, the earthenware factory created this set of three superimposed plates, intended to offer gastronomes, seafood lovers, thirty oysters on a single display, with the

These four pieces are in very good condition and bear the hollow marks in the center of the pedestals and under the first cover: LONGCHAMP TERRE DE FER 1228. The Longchamp factory continues to create new shapes and new decorations, with a remarkable sense of modernity and poetry.

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
