Description

Slightly flared silver and crystal candy dish, decorated on the edge with an openwork geometric frieze and on the belly, with motifs representing a spindle-shaped vase framed by confronting birds. These birds are tasting bunches of grapes escaping from the vase. Two handles decorated with women holding a palmette. The lid is topped with palms forming the grip. The base of the candy dish is decorated with a stylized palmette frieze and rests on four claw feet.

Restoration period, circa 1820-1830. Weight: 441 gr. Guarantee mark: head of Ceres. (1819-1838).

Title mark: Head of Michelangelo (1819-1838).

Re-inspection of the head of Minerva. Master silversmith: LN for Naudin inscribed 1812.
