Danielle Quarante is a French designer, born on June 22, 1938 in Sarcelles. She lives and works in Paris. She entered the École Nationale Supérieure des Arts Décoratifs in 1959. She creates objects in molded wood, thermoformable materials or polyester. Her stackable chairs and tables "Balthazar" were selected for the Prisunic-Shell competition in 1972. She was the first to introduce design training into an engineering curriculum, at the
