However, he was interned in the Ostlinde forced labour camp in 1944 due to his Jewish origins. Following the end of Nazi rule, he worked as a photographer at the National

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Fehmarner Str. 16 Berlin 13353 Theatre in Weimar from 1947 to 1950. He then moved to Munich and became a photojournalist. He produced photos for magazines such as Revue, Magnum, Twen and Quick. He became widely known for the photo reportages he produced for Stern magazine between 1960 and 1968. Moses created artistic records of contemporary and social history, particularly through his portraits of people at work, first in West Germany and then in East Germany. Other notable photo series include: Animal and Its Man, The Trans-Siberian Railway, The Great Old Ones, Self in the Mirror, Artists Make Masks and Emigrants and Jews in Germany. Stefan Moses received many honours and awards, including admission to the Bavarian Academy of Fine Arts in 1994, the Federal Cross of Merit First Class in 2004, and the Lovis Corinth Prize in 2014.
