Description

Rare Bronze Lamp Signed F. Barbedienne - 19th Century - After Carrier-BelleuseElegant and refined, this rare gilt bronze lamp dates from the 19th century. It is a decorative work representing Victoria, the goddess of Victory, depicted standing and holding two light arms in the form of floral torches. This model demonstrates a neoclassical taste typical of the Second Empire. The design is attributed to the famous sculptor Albert-Ernest Carrier-Belleuse (1824-1887), known for his sensual and expressive works blending antique inspiration and romanticism. A collaborator of Rodin in his early years, Carrier-Belleuse was one of the major artists of the revival of the decorative arts under Napoleon III. He worked for the Manufacture de Sèvres and produced many decorative sculptures
