



Charles Royer - Portrait Of A Woman Seen From Three-quarters Back - Oil On Panel - Signed



Description

Portrait of a young woman, bust-length, naked to the waist, made on a support that remains difficult to determine (wood? a type of hardboard?). The portrait stands out against a dark background, in brown tones. The light is concentrated on the shoulder and face. The woman is captured from ³/₄ back. The expression is pensive, as if the woman had been surprised by the artist. This subject is characteristic of Charles Royer's productions. The young woman has a face typical of the late 19th / early 20th century. The work is signed C. Royer at the bottom left (signature barely visible, in the dark part). It is in good condition. There is a discreet retouch on the shoulder. The frame is period (late 19th - early 20th century), with some visible restorations but no losses. Royer was born and worked in Langres
