Description

Kachan Dabir rug (Iran), made in the workshop of the famous Master Weaver Dabir, renowned for his work with the royal court, as was Master Mortachemi. A rare work, specially commissioned by Bannayan, dating from the first half of the 20th century. Woven from approximately 70 to 80% silk with lambswool (Kork) inlays on a silk and cotton foundation, this rug has a remarkable density of approximately 9,000 to 10,000 knots/dm². The golden yellow silk field is decorated with fine symmetrical floral scrolls, framing a central diamond-shaped medallion, trimmed with a multicolored lambswool spray. The ivory silk border is delicately decorated with polychrome flower sprays, enhanced with a navy blue medallion bearing the inscription "Commission Bannayan".
