



Sculpture - Group Of Woodcocks With A Frog , Leon Bureau (1866-1906) - Bronze



Description

Important bronze group with double patina, brown and gold, representing two woodcocks, accompanied by a frog, resting under the paw of one of them , by the sculptor Leon Bureau (1866-1906). The woodcocks appear with finely chiseled plumage, a massive body, a long beak and their outstretched wings . Jules Moigniez pays particular attention to anatomical details, his works are considered remarkably detailed, with very thorough chiseling, completed by an elegance in the attitudes . Bronze group signed "L.Bureau" on the side of the naturalist terrace, richly chiseled and decorated with plants . Old edition sculpture, period second part of the 19th century.
