Description

Important bronze group with double patina , brown and gold , representing two woodcocks , accompanied by a frog , resting under the paw of one of them , by the sculptor Leon Bureau (1866-1906) . The woodcocks appear with finely chiseled plumage , a massive body , a long beak and their outstretched wings . Jules Moigniez pays particular attention to anatomical details , his works are considered remarkably detailed , with very thorough chiseling , completed by an elegance in the attitudes . Bronze group signed "L.Bureau" on the side of the naturalist terrace , richly chiseled and decorated with plants . Old edition sculpture , period second part of the 19th century . Perfect state of conservation .

animal sculptor , born in Limoges on September 17 , 1906 .A specialist in exotic animals , he began his apprenticeship with the sculptor Alexandre Falguiere (1831-1900) , and first exhibited at the French Artists Salon in 1884 .He exhibited mainly plaster casts , a number of which were cast in bronze .He died on May 26, 1906, in his native Limoges .Some works :Quail listening (1885)Royal Tiger in Cambodia (1891)Tiger and snake fight (1894)Child with crab (1896)Jaguar devouring an eagle (1899)
