Description

A finely modeled and well-preserved pair of porcelain figures, produced by Bros. Voigt & Alfred Voigt, Sitzendorf, Thuringia, circa 1887. The composition shows a seated girl and boy, each accompanied by a pet lamb -- a theme often associated with innocence and sentiment in 19th-century decorative art. The girl is feeding her lamb with a gilded spoon, while the boy gently strokes his lamb in a quiet gesture of affection. Both are richly hand-painted, with detailed floral garments and finely preserved gilt highlights. Their facial modeling and expressive gestures are precisely executed.

The white lace-like elements of their clothing are formed using actual fabric dipped in porcelain slip and fired - a

technique known as porcelain lace or Dresden lace. Sitzendorf was particularly recognized for its mastery of this delicate process during the Voigt period.

The base with underglaze blue cross-hatch mark, attributed to the Sitzendorf factory, in use from around 1887. These child-themed Rococo figures were a hallmark of their production and remain desirable collector's items. Condition: Boy: minor lace losses, small firing flaw to the base (from manufacture); otherwise in excellent condition.

Girl: minor lace losses only; gilding and painting well preserved.
