Before the war, he opened a ceramics studio in his hometown and spent time with Picasso, which contributed to his relative fame. Unpretentious, he devoted his life to painting simple, rural, sun-drenched scenes from nature. Gifted with a keen sense of observation and a remarkable gift for color, Camos painted a vibrant and luminous Provence. A poet at heart, he loved to sing and
