



## Venetian Carved And Gilded Frame - Late 17th / Early 18th Century



## Description

Refined Venetian frame in late Baroque style, dating from the late 1600s to the early 1700s, later converted into a mirror in the early 20th century. Made of softwood, likely Swiss pine (cirmolo), it features rich hand-carved cartouche motifs, with strong plasticity and movement, echoing the ornamental taste of the Venetian school, possibly influenced by the so-called "Gusto d'Oron". The frame is entirely hand-carved and finished with gold leaf gilding and a light greenish lacquer, which enhances the depth and volume of the decorative elements. The chromatic contrast between gold and lacquer creates a striking, theatrical effect, typical of Venetian frames made to complement fine paintings or important mirrors. The back bears a label marked "Belluno" and the number 153, supporting its
