Important bronze proof with brown patina, representing a young woman captivated by the return of the swallows, by the sculptor Auguste Moreau (1834-1917) . She appears seated on a richly decorated naturalist base, observing the swallows that have just landed at her feet. The scene illustrates the dreamed harmony between Humans and Nature .Sculpture titled in a cartouche "Return of the Swallows by Aug. Moreau Gold Medal at the Exhibition". Signature of the sculptor "Auguste Moreau", hollow on the terrace. Antique bronze, period second part of the 19th century, circa 1880. Very good condition of conservation and patina. Auguste Moreau began sculpture with his older brother Mathurin Moreau . In 1861, he made his debut at the Salon, where he exhibited regularly until 1913 .He is related to the "Moreau" dynasty with his subjects and genre scenes, pastorals, allegories, and his realistic and graceful style. Auguste Moreau produced mainly artistic bronzes .Auguste Moreau died on November 11, 1917, in Malesherbes . Several of his works are kept at the Museum of Fine Arts in Troye and the Museum of Fine Arts in Bordeaux .
