Description

An elegant pastoral scene from the late 19th century, this oil on canvas poetically depicts a young shepherdess watching over her flock of sheep in the heart of a mountain landscape bathed in soft, golden light. The atmosphere is calm, silent, almost meditative. Seated on a rocky promontory, the female figure stands out naturally in a harmonious setting, between misty skies and golden hillsides. The subtly constructed composition blends the intimacy of the rural scene with the feeling of immensity of the Alpine landscape. This painting is in the tradition of French naturalist painters of the second half of the 19th century, in the wake of the Barbizon school. It shares with the works of Millet, Troyon, and Jacque this tender gaze on peasant life, but in a brighter and more peaceful tone. We

The supple yet precise brushstrokes bring the textures of the rock, wool, and foliage to life with fine technical mastery.
