Biography: Jules MOIGNIEZ 1835/1894 Jules Moigniez is a French animal sculptor, born on May 28, 1835 in Senlis and died on May 29, 1894 in Saint-Martin-du-Tertre. His father was a metal gilder. Moigniez was a student of Paul Comolera (1818-1897), a great sculptor specializing in birds. His master was Paul Comoléra, who was a student of François Rude. Moigniez exhibited his

first sculpture, Pointer Dog Stopping a Pheasant, at the 1855 Universal Exhibition in Paris at the age of twenty. He then exhibited regularly at the Salon from 1859 to 1892, where he received an honorable mention in his first year. He presented his sculptures again at the Universal Exhibition in Paris in 1878. Moigniez enjoyed success, particularly in England and the United States. Indeed, his works were considered remarkably detailed, with very thorough chiseling, complemented by elegance in the attitudes. Faced with his son's success, his father created a foundry especially for him. Ill for several years, he committed suicide on May 29, 1894 in Saint-Martin-du-Tertre, where he is buried.
