Description

Rare and antique 18th-century solid silver spoon. The spoon's spatula is teardrop-shaped, without the classic shoulder found on the vast majority of flatware from this period, and is highlighted with a double line. It is engraved with the number DF (?) within a Swiss shield framed by two palm leaves and surmounted by a wreath of flowers. This later engraving dates from the 19th century and was probably made as a wedding gift. The spoon is richly and finely pierced with concentric geometric motifs forming arabesques and plant friezes. This type of pierced work, organized in concentric registers, is less common than the more classic motif of wide scrolls. The spoon is hallmarked:. Traces of the charge, jurande, and silversmith's mark are illegible.. Discharge mark: a fox's head, struck in
