Description

18th Century Brussels Tapestry: Apotheosis of Juno This tapestry depicts a mythological scene of Greco-Roman inspiration: the apotheosis of Juno, the Roman goddess of marriage, royalty, and women. Known as Hera in Greek mythology, Juno is depicted here in all her divine majesty. The goddess, crowned and draped in a sumptuous mantle adorned with peacock feathers--Juno's emblematic animal--is lifted into the air by a flock of winged putti (cherubs), celestial figures that reinforce the divine character of the scene. In her hand, she holds a golden scepter, symbolizing her sovereign authority alongside Jupiter (Zeus). Her starry garment, serene features, and ethereal posture embody power, beauty, and majesty. The cloudy setting and diffused light suggest a celestial realm, while the richness of the details
