representations. Emmanuel Samson Chamchain, known as Emmanuel Samson (1860-1926), was a French painter and sculptor specializing in 19th and 20th century wildlife art. Born in Paris on May 5, 1860, he grew up in an artistic environment, influenced by his family and his uncles, including Alfred Meyer, a renowned ceramicist and enameller. A student of the painters Alphonse de Neuville and Jean-Léon Gérôme, he developed his talent and exhibited his works at the Salon des Indépendants in 1889.
