Idoma Okua Mask Wood with white patina Ht. 24cm 538grs (strong marks of use and age, rubbing and patina wear) First half of the 20th century - EUR650 - Living in Nigeria, at the confluence of the Benue and Niger rivers, the Idoma people have acquired an artistic reputation for their fertile female figures and their masks with faces covered in white kaolin. Okua masks are worn, among the southern Idoma, during the funerals of important figures. They are recognizable by their stylized scarifications, a white patina and a smooth hairstyle, as well as an open mouth.
