COMBAT HANDKERCHIEF called Taiaha -CURIOSMaori culture, New Zealand, Polynesia20th centuryWood and mother-of-pearlLength: 104; L.: 9 cmCarved with a Janus head, called upoko, with mother-of-pearl disk-encrusted eyes, and a long hanging tongue, the arero, punctuated with symmetrical scroll motifs. The cylindrical shaft is fitted with a grip called a tinana, and flares out at the proximal end to form the rau - the flattened end serving as a puzzle. This weapon is also a symbol of authority.
