Description

Much charm emanates from this evocation of the old port of Saint Tropez. In a myriad of small touches of juxtaposed colors, purple, blue, green, ochre, red, brown, yellow, Marcel Cogniet composes a universe of warmth and light specific to the south of France. A boat, old decrepit walls, a few hanging vines, wooden utensils and a net at the foot of a low wall, just testimonies of a fisherman's life in the authentic St Tropez, the picturesque village which attracted artists at the beginning of the 20th century, before bewitching the "jet set". Marcel Cogniet was born on March 11, 1857 in Paris and died in 1914.
