Flintlock plate signed "Mre Imple de Tulle" (Imperial Manufacture of Tulle), with heart-shaped cock and straight comb - characteristic of the official production of the time.

Brass trigger guard and sideplate. Well-preserved wooden stock.

Original steel ramrod with "nail-head" tip, matching the official model. Several inspection marks visible (including

crowned "C").
