Description

An authentic officer's dress sword knot (portepée), likely originating from the Imperial German or Prussian military, dating from the late 19th to early 20th century. It was designed to be affixed to the hilt of a ceremonial sabre and worn as part of a formal officer's uniform, particularly among cavalry or guard regiments.

Crafted in gold bullion-style cord, the piece features:

A thick braided suspension cord with a hand-tied fastening loop

A central woven knot ball (slide) for secure fitting

Two ornately plaited flat discs, displaying traditional interlace patterns

Dual wool or silk tassels, richly twisted and intact
