



Set Of 4 Ancient Roman Glass Unguentaria, Early Provenance

Description

An outstanding set of four ancient Roman miniature glass unguentaria, expertly crafted in the core-formed technique with classic blue and white "trail" ornamentation. Dated to the Hellenistic-Roman period, 2nd century BC-3rd century AD. Each measures between 5.5 and 6.1 cm in height. All are in excellent archaeological condition with some light encrustation and one example showing a neck crack (see photographs); none restored.

This collection is housed in a rare early 20th-century industrial box from The Cleveland Twist Drill Co., Cleveland, Ohio, U.S.A. -- a world-leading manufacturer of high-speed drill bits, founded 1876 and merged into Acme-Cleveland in 1968. This provenance suggests a unique history, likely belonging to an
