## Description

A finely crafted 19th-century porcelain perfume bottle, attributed to Royal Worcester, c. 1870. The surface is entirely covered in hand-applied flower encrustation, with each individual bloom modelled and attached by hand. This labor-intensive technique, often referred to as forget-me-not encrustation, is associated with Worcester's most elaborate decorative work of the Victorian period.

encrustation features dense clusters of small blue-tipped flowers with yellow centers, arranged to create a richly textured floral surface. The original Dealer
