Description

An 18th-century Sevres soft paste porcelain lobed sugar (sucrier 'ovale') or chestnut (marronniere) oval bowl and cover, decorated with flower sprays and dentil gilding, the lid with a looped, entwined branch handle. Marks: Underglaze blue interlaced "L"s. Date letter "D" for 1756. Decorators mark, possibly Binet? Incised mark Measurements: Height: 12cm (4.7in) Width: 15cm (5.9in) Depth: 11.5cm (4.5in) Condition: The lid is a fairly loose fit, moving approximately one centimetre across the length of the bowl and half a centimetre across its depth. As a consequence, the top of the gilding of the bowl rim is quite worn where it has been abraded by the movement of the cover. There is a kiln accretion spot on the inside of the bowl. The lid has a light scattering of firing spots. No repairs or
