Description

Elegant French sculpture from the Art Deco period, depicting a nude dancer holding a globe in a dynamic and theatrical pose. Created circa 1925-1930, this piece captures the modernist spirit of the era, celebrating the freedom of the female form and the rhythm of movement. The figure is cast in silvered bronze, a favored technique during the interwar years for its luminous sheen and refined appearance. The surface shows a subtle original patina with natural wear, enhancing the authenticity of the piece. The dancer stands on a geometric onyx and marble base, shaped like a stepped pyramid - a hallmark of Art Deco design vocabulary. The base is accented with black marble steps and green onyx triangular inlays. This refined mix of materials - bronze, marble, and onyx - reflects the

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luxury and stylistic modernity of the time.

The entire composition suggests an architectural mise-en-scène, where the tension between the dancer's upward motion and the solidity of the base creates a compelling visual balance. The pale alabaster or light onyx globe delicately balanced on her fingertips may represent the moon or a celestial body, adding a poetic, dreamlike dimension to the work.
