eclectic work ranges from the Alpilles landscapes depicting Provençal cabins to fields of olive trees, lavender, and poppies. The small fishing ports of the Mediterranean coast deeply inspire him.

Hyper-realistic still lifes with bouquets of flowers in a thousand colors. But also series on the famous Venice Carnival and these beautiful Venetian masks. His work on bullfighting and the beautiful Arlesiennes is also surprisingly lively and full of movement. A fan of large formats, which he particularly likes, he masters the space. Numerous solo exhibitions in Arles, Fontvieille, then group exhibitions abroad, Italy Venice and San Remo where he won the Grand Prix.

Internationally recognized, he will obtain several Gold medals, including the last at the Salon Sebora in San Remo, Italy. His work is officially listed.
