

High-quality piece in perfect original condition. Biography - Giacomo Sinopoli: Giacomo Sinopoli is an Italian designer active in the 1970s, known for his collaborations with the Roman house Liwan's. Part of the modernist design movement, his work combines geometric rigor with refined materials. His creations--particularly jewelry boxes and decorative objects--stand out for their use of chrome-plated metal, colored glass, and meticulous detailing. Collaborations with Italian designers such as Giacomo Sinopoli resulted in a limited series of functional yet refined objects. Although little documented, Liwan's is now regaining interest among collectors of Italian mid-century

design.
