A beautifully preserved Minton tea set decorated in the Japanese Kakiemon style with a stylised tiger among bamboo, peony blossoms and a cascading waterfall. Vivid ochre red, cobalt and royal blues, bright greens and black accents are enhanced with gilt. Saucers carry the full scene; cups repeat the motif outside and have a delicate floral spray painted inside with gilded rims. The matching cream jug has a moulded scroll handle and foot, decorated all

Saucers

dated by impressed marks: horseshoe for 1853 (five pieces) and three radiating lines for 1861 (five pieces). The cups span a slightly earlier range, including one as early as 1847, showing the continuity of the pattern across several years of production. Cream jug unmarked, as is common for this period.

centre of the well, and one 1853 saucer with a star

hairline to the centre of

the well; otherwise the saucers are in brilliant

condition, with colours and

enamels perfectly preserved and only minimal,

barely visible rubbing to the

gilding in a few places.

Cups: one with a fine hairline to the side; one

with a

crack at the lower handle terminal; one with a

small firing hairline at the

handle join; the remainder excellent with bright

enamels and only light rim

gilding wear.

Cream jug: excellent antique condition, no chips

or

repairs, bright enamels and gilding very well

preserved.
