On the back is related in approximate French a military fact "on August 25, 1810 a detachment of 15 hunters of the 29th regiment which was part of the right lancers of the first brigade of the Lamarque division met Arengo Delmont a company of hussars of Saint Narsis in (battle) on the square the brave sergeant Fabre who commanded the hunters did not hesitate for a moment he got on the enemy he attacked the commanding officer whom he knocked down with three blows of his sabre his hunters limited and the enemy fled leaving our power 17 mounted hussars a number was wounded and pursued as far as Montenegro. attached military papers ministry of war appointment to a position of second lieutenant

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Paris 1816, regiment of the Pyrenees 17 horse hunters successive service Dr Fabre campaign of the armies of 1808 09 10 11 12 13 14 to the army of Catalonia certified in Chartres in 1822, extract from death certificate taken in Villalba made in Burgos in 1823, record of the sale of effects belonging to Fabre killed in Villalba in 1823. In April 1823 the army of the Pyrenees entered Spain under the order of the Duke of Angoulême at the request of Ferdinand who in 1822 requested the help of European monarchs according to the Treaty of Vienna to put an end to the constitutional regime. This army included many veterans of the empire.
