Observation of the various ways of dealing with civil law according to the greatest ancient jurists, Ulpian, Justinian, etc. By Jacques Cujas, Jurisconsult, legal historian and philosopher (1522-1590), He was a student of Barthélémy Faye, Arnaud du Ferrier and Michel de l'Hospital. He is the main representative of legal humanism in Europe and his patron was the Duchess of Berry, Marguerite de France. The list of his students is very revealing: Jacques-Auguste de Thou, Joseph Juste Scaliger, Antoine Loysel, Paul de Foix, Pierre
