Description

This Tabwa statue consists of two human figures placed back to back, their hands clasped and their heads slightly inclined forward. This solemn posture expresses reflection, spiritual vigilance, or a form of inner communication. The duality evokes sacred twins, ancestors, or two complementary protective forces. Sculpted with finesse, it reflects the characteristic aesthetic of the Tabwa: serene faces, ritual symmetry, and restrained expressiveness. Placed in a sanctuary or used during divinatory practices, this work served as an interface with the invisible world, anchored in a symbolic system where human pairs embody balance and ancestral memory.
