collectors of French interwar art, this original oil on cardboard highlights Mazaleyrat's sensitivity to both figure and environment, offering a glimpse into 1930s French culture and style.Pierre-Paul Mazaleyrat was a French painter born on June 20, 1901, in Grandsaigne (Corrèze) and passed away in Paris on October 26, 1961. He studied at the prestigious École des Beaux-Arts in Bordeaux, where he developed his academic training and artistic vision. Early in his career, he exhibited at the Salon des Indépendants Les Amis de l'Art in Bordeaux, presenting works that highlighted his talent for portraiture and landscape painting. Mazaleyrat's art is distinguished by its elegant balance between figure and setting. His portraits often feature refined sitters placed against natural or rural backgrounds, blending realism with the freshness of open-air painting. Through this approach, Mazaleyrat captured not only the likeness of his subjects but also the atmosphere of French provincial life during the early 20th century. Active throughout the interwar period and beyond, Mazaleyrat produced few works that reflect both the intimacy of personal portraiture and the broader traditions of French painting.
