Description

Drawing in black chalk and charcoal, project for the 1956 edition of "Splendeurs d'Aix-en-Provence" by J. Bertot in Marseille. Edouard-Emmanuel-Charles Pannetier, Provençal painter and orientalist, was born on November 6, 1884 in Clermont-Ferrand (Auvergne). Orphaned by his father, a former English teacher, he began his artistic studies at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in his hometown and then at the Ecole des Arts Décoratifs in Paris. Trained as a drawing teacher, he worked for several years in Algeria at the Lamoricière high school in Oran between 1910 and 1920. Back in France, he worked as a drawing teacher at the high school in Aix-en-Provence around 1930. He painted numerous landscapes and genre scenes of Algeria and Provence. For the rest, he illustrated several
