In 1945 he was awarded the third medal at the National Exhibition of Fine Arts with a work depicting the martyr Saint Sebastian. In 1947 he won the chair of natural modeling at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts of San Carlos by competition and in 1948 he obtained the second medal of the Exhibition of Fine Arts of Madrid with two reliefs "La música profana" y la música religiosa" He obtained the first prize for Mediterranean sculpture in Alicante in 1957. In 1958 he received the national sculpture prize and in 1959 the Guadalquivir prize in Seville Sold with Invoice and Certificate.
