A student of Paul Lauters and Joseph Stallaert at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Brussels, he was one of the founding members of the "L'Essor" and "Pour l'Art" circles, two major artistic movements in Belgian art. At the beginning of his career, he worked in several artistic professions, such as typographer, engraver, and sign painter, before devoting himself mainly to illustration. He illustrated the Legend of Uylenspiegel, as well as publications by Huysmans and Hannon. His style is characterized by fine lines, attention to detail, and a taste for picturesque scenes and everyday life. A
