Description

A well-modelled French porcelain figure attributed to Samson, Paris, c.1880, in the Dresden style. The standing gallant plays a hurdy-gurdy; rococo scroll base with stump support and tricorne hat. Dense white body, glossy glaze and bouquet-sprig painting point to Samson's Paris production. The hurdy-gurdy motif--rooted in rococo and the commedia dell'arte--was revived by late-19th-century Paris workshops and turned into a salon subject. In mid-18th-century France the instrument came into fashion among the aristocracy; composers including Vivaldi wrote for it. Comparable porcelain figures and groups are documented in
