French painter, illustrator and poster artist, self-taught, Eugène Bourgeois began at the Salon of 1874. He exhibited there in 1880, as well as at the Salon of French Artists of 1881 where he received a medal of honor that year, then a 3rd class medal in 1885. He also received the bronze medal at the Universal Exhibition of 1889 and that of 1900.
