Charming orientalist watercolor signed lower right Crapelet, dated 1864. It represents a rider mounted on his camel, progressing on a sandy expanse. In the background unfolds an Egyptian landscape on the banks of the Nile, with a village dominated by a minaret and surrounded by palm groves opposite. The sky is crossed by a flight of migratory birds, accentuating the poetry and movement of the scene. His compositions are characterized by great attention to atmospheric light, vibrant skies and subtle color gradations, which are fully apparent in this watercolor.
