He was the son of Jean-Baptiste Beurdeley, a saddler and harness maker in the Murat Regiment who later became an antiques dealer. In 1835, he took over his father's business, the "bronze and curiosities" workshop. During the Second Empire, he diversified the family business by incorporating furniture and art objects. He exhibited several art
