Quality furniture Embodying the refinement of French furniture, it will bring prestige and luxury to your home. Maurice RINCK (1902 - 1983), Meubles Rinck was founded in 1841 in Alsace by the cabinetmaker Jacques Rinck. In 1871, the war forced him to settle in Paris, at 8 Passage de la Bonne Graine, in the 11th arrondissement. In 1866, Meubles Rinck created a cabinetmaking school: the Ecole de la Bonne Graine. Located today on Boulevard Voltaire in Paris's 11th arrondissement in the Meuble district near the Faubourg Saint Antoine, this school continues to train in woodworking. In the 1930s, Maurice Rinck, Eugène Rinck's son, understood the importance of the Art Deco trend and infused this style into the house's creations. He thus gave his letters of nobility to the Maison RINCK by working with the greatest designers of the time: renowned decorators and interior designers (Ruhlman, Leleu, etc.) placed orders and signed unique pieces, today heritage of the group. In 1937, Maurice Rinck won the gold medal for innovation at the Grand Prix of the Paris International Exhibition. In 1957, he was awarded the Grand Prix of the Brussels International Exhibition, tied with Citroën and its DS and with Christian Dior. Meubles Rinck produces classic or contemporary prestige furniture. Relying on an integrated design workshop, a design office, unique archives, and the tradition of a noble profession, Meubles Rinck stands out for the excellence of its work, respect for tradition, creativity, adaptability and spirit of service. It has great know-how in the design and manufacture of prestige furniture and woodwork. The company

thus masters all the specialties of its trade: cabinetmaking, marquetry, bronze work, sculpture, lacquer, traditional varnishes, work with rare materials. In addition, its archives, its collection of drawings, bronzes and materials allow it to respond to the most demanding orders. During the 1980s-1990s, Rinck was the leading exporter of furniture for the luxury industries. Today the Meubles RINCK workshops are managed by Bruno Sachet, a high-level cabinetmaker, trained by the greatest cabinetmaking schools, and associate partner of Thierry Goux.
