Description

Very beautiful autochrome bordered in blue circa 1920. A woman with a large hat poses under a tree and in front of a lake. In the background stands a large building. Format 9 x 12 cm "This is not a snapshot, but the reproduction of a frozen and composed moment, illuminated by an impression, a sensation of color generated by multiple touches of pigments modeled by the brush of light" Institut Lumière. Filed as a patent in 1903 but unveiled at the Academy of Sciences in 1904, the Autochrome Lumière plate, invented by Louis Lumière, is the first color photography process.
