Description

Mythological scene attributed to the well-known Czech painter and graphic artist Karel Spillar (1871-1939). Spillar attended high school in Prague, and then, from 1885-1893, studied at the School of Applied Arts in Prague under Frantisek Zenísek while also getting his education at the Academy of Fine Arts. Spillar also maintained a studio with his close friend Jan Preisler in Prague. The artist took several trips to Italy, Spain and London. From 1902 to 1908, he was based in France, mainly in Paris and Onival in Normandy, where a new movement involving the Czech artists F. Simon, Hugo Boettinger and Otakar Spaniel was formed. In 1912 Spillar became the successor of Preisler as drawing teacher at the School of Applied Arts in Prague; in 1925 he became a full professor. Spillar produced many

Spillar is known today for several murals in Prague and the mosaic Apotheosis of Prague on the local community center.
