Description

Beautiful between-two piece of furniture in rosewood marquetry. It opens on the front with 3 storage drawers, a niche for displaying an art object or storing books and 2 side drawers for writing utensils. At the top, a leather-covered writing desk, with a sloping side, closed by a gilded bronze gallery. Parisian work from the Louis XVI period, 1780s. A commissioned piece of furniture, it is a variation of the barber's desk, of which it takes the general structure. Masculine object, intended for a busy and active man who wishes to write his letters standing up. Its format allows it to be cleverly placed between 2 windows, but it can also be placed in the center of a room, since its back is veneered with mahogany. Beautiful amateur piece, an unusual collector's piece. It is in excellent condition.
