Hermann Lindenschmidt was a German painter born in 1857 in Frankfurt and died in 1939 in Munich. He worked mainly in oil painting and is known for his genre scenes, landscapes, portraits, and peasant interiors, often marked by rural themes and a naturalistic approach.

Lindenschmidt exhibited in Munich and Frankfurt and produced numerous works now visible in collections, including watercolors and drawings.

Style and techniques o Predilection for oil on canvas, sometimes watercolor or drawing. o Search for rural veracity and intimate scenes. o Often signed "H. Lindenschmidt". Hermann Lindenschmidt is therefore a recognized figure of German naturalism of the end of the 19th century, appreciated for his rural scenes and his portraits imbued with realism.
