Decorated with two snakes, tails tied with a wide blue ribbon, framing the phylactery  
Ref.: 25/G/65  
Stin-bearing earthenware with white slip  
Phylactery: "TAMARINDI" Height: 19 cm  
Condition of use : A crack in the neck (see photos)  
Pharmacopoeia: TAMARINDI: Tamarind tree (or Tamarind extract)  
TAMARINDI refers to *Tamarindus indica*, a tree whose fruit is mainly used for its medicinal properties.  
Pharmaceutical Use: Tamarind is known for its laxative properties and is often used in treatments for constipation.  
Antioxidant: Tamarind pulp is rich in antioxidants, thus contributing to cell protection.  
Antimicrobial: It also has antimicrobial and anti-inflammatory properties.
